

What's for breakfast?



Bacon meat from WA pigs is salted, smoked and sliced to give us the tasty rashers for our breakfast.



Eggs laid by chickens are collected, cleaned and sorted by weight into cartons.



Tomato WA tomatoes are grown in market gardens and greenhouses. Once picked, they are packed into trays or punnets.

Food for thought The average hen lays 260 eggs per year – that's one egg laid every week day with no holidays!

Oats Wheatbelt farmers grow and harvest oats. Oats are rolled in factories, ready for porridge.



Milk South West dairy farmers milk cows twice a day by machine. Milk is taken to a factory where it is processed and packaged.



Honey Bees collect nectar from WA's forests and orchards and return to their hives to make honey.

Food for thought To collect enough nectar for a 500g jar of honey, bees visit two million flowers and fly 88 000km - that's twice around the world!

Bread WA farmers grow wheat that is harvested and milled into flour, ready for making bread.



Butter At a factory, cream is separated from milk collected from WA dairies and churned (thickened) to make butter.



Filling Your sandwich is filled with chicken raised on WA poultry farms and salad vegetables grown in WA.

Food for thought In 2013, WA farmers produced 10.2 million tonnes of wheat – enough to produce 1.5 loaves of bread for every Australian every day!

Cheese Good bacteria and rennet is added to milk to make curds. Curds are salted and pressed into blocks forming cheese.



Guacamole uses the best WA avocados mixed with fresh chilli, coriander, onion, tomato and lime.



Hummus WA farmers grow chickpeas, which are blended with garlic, lemon juice and olive oil to make a great dip.

Food for thought Western Australia produces almost a third of Australia's avocados and we export to South East Asia and the Middle East.

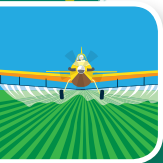

Apple pie Apples grown in orchards in the South West and Perth Hills are picked in autumn and available all year!



Yoghurt bacteria converts lactose to lactic acid, which thickens the milk and gives it the tangy taste characteristic of yogurt.



Mixed berries grown in WA's South West are freshly picked cleaned and packaged.

Sausages meat is ground, mixed with herbs and cereals packed into casings.



Onions grown on South West farms are harvested and taken to sheds for drying, grading and packing before being sent to market.
